Ashlands Church of England First School Uniform Policy

Our policy towards the wearing of uniform allows our children and their families or carers to demonstrate their respect for our School, as well as helping to eliminate problems caused by peer on peer negativity around fashion, money and taste. The wearing of our uniform helps our children view their school as a community of equals, and promotes a sense of belonging to our school community.

Foundation Stage, Key Stage 1 and 2

Across the school our children wear red tops (sweatshirts, cardigans or sweaters) which have the school logo and red polo shirts, which have the option of being with or without a school logo. These are worn with grey trousers, knee length shorts, skirts or pinafore dresses. Red gingham dresses may be worn by girls in summer although parents should remember these may not be suitable for all activities.

Plain, dark, shoes are worn by all the children, Velcro is great choice of fastener as it allows the younger children more independence. Shoes with a pronounced heel must not be worn. In the summer sandals may be worn but again these should be plain, dark and have closed toes. Socks should be plain grey or white. Tights should be plain, these can be grey, white or red.

Sports Kit

Your child must have a PE kit of black shorts, plain red T shirt (not a football shirt) and plimsolls or trainers, kept in a PE bag (clearly named) and in school every day. An outdoor kit is also required during colder months; this should be plain black or grey joggers and a plain red sweatshirt, and possibly some older trainers.

Children having swimming lessons will need a swimming costume (not bikini) or swimming shorts fit for purpose (not surf/board shorts), goggles and a towel.

Expectations

We expect children to appear tidy and wear their uniform smartly. You are asked to label your child's clothing clearly (including shoes) to minimise the amount of time spent searching for and returning 'lost' items.

The wearing of all cosmetic jewellery is strongly discouraged, although children may wear a watch. Children may wear one pair of plain stud earrings, these must be removed during PE lessons, or covered with protective tape supplied from home.

Hairstyles

Long hair should be tied back. Small hair accessories are acceptable, oversized accessories such as giant bows are not acceptable. The School discourages some specific hairstyles, for example shaved lines and marks or coloured hair.

Bookbags

We encourage children from Reception up to Year 2 to use book bags to transport books, homework and personal items between school and home. In Year 3 and 4 the children may bring their belongings in their own backpack but this should be clearly named.
